Ponta Delgada Gardens

- António Borges Garden**
Created by António Borges in the 19th century, this is one of the municipality's green lungs and displays a rich botanical collection.
- José do Canto Botanical Garden**
A space designed by José do Canto, this is a public garden that presents the José do Canto Palace, one of the paladin buildings of the 20th century.
- Antero de Quental Garden**
Located in Colégio Square, this garden pays tribute to Antero de Quental. There you will find a statue alluding to the poet by Canto da Maia.
- Mártires da Pátria Garden**
Located next to the Fonte Bela Palace, now Antero de Quental Secondary School. Small garden with benches, trees and esplanade coffee.
- Padre Sena Freitas Garden**
Located in Ponta Delgada downtown, this is a garden with several botanical species, perfect for outdoor walks.
- Urban Park**
This is the largest green area in the municipality. Inside there is a maintenance circuit and a great pedestrian circuit for physical exercise.
- Duque de Bragança Promenade (Relvão)**
So named because of the duke's passing. An important place in the liberal battles, the trees planted there symbolise the soldiers on parade.
- Sec. XXI Park**
It is a public garden of around 12,000 m². It has various educational equipment, making it an ideal space for families.
- Padre Fernando Vieira Gomes (Mata da Doca) Garden**
A recent space that resulted from the requalification of the area called "Mata da Doca".
- São Francisco Square**
It is the largest square in the city and one of the largest in the Azores. It has hosted the Senhor Santo Cristo dos Milagres Festivities for over 300 years.
